



World skin experts to gather on the Gold Coast May 17th – 20th 2009

The early detection of melanoma, and the incidence of skin cancer amongst organ transplant patients are key topics to be examined at the Australasian College of Dermatologists' 42nd Annual Scientific Meeting, to be held on the Gold Coast in May.

Some of the world's leading authorities on skin conditions and cosmetic procedures are gathering on the Gold Coast to discuss "all things skin", including the Vitamin D debate, the link between diet and acne, and the role of cosmeceuticals in dermatology.

The early detection of melanoma by skin self-examination, and trends in melanoma incidence are also on the agenda, as well as the future of lasers and light-based technology.

Other topics high on the list of discussion include:

- Emerging acne treatments
- Teledermatology
- Cosmetic Dermatology
- The basics of cleansers, and natural skin care products
